The purpose of this bill is to insure that a conspecialized professional resources tinuity of available to blind and vision impaired children throughout their educational careers such that their and vocational potential can full academic with the Education of realized in accordance Handicapped Children Act of 1975 (PL 94-142), the Vocational Education Act (PL 94-482) and the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (PL 93-112). The Division of Eye Care, within the Department of Human Services, Bureau of Rehabilitation, has maintained the specialized capability professional to provide appropriate, legally mandated services to blind and vision impaired students in a comprehensive manner which emphasizes a continuity of services. This bill required to avoid an arbitrary division of responsibility between the division and the Department of Educational and Cultural Services which may result in fragmentation of the current service delivery system for all blind and vision impaired students in Maine.
