	AN ACT to Require Review of Road Construction.
	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
	Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §488, 2nd \P , as enacted by PL 1979, c. 714, is repealed.
	Sec. 2. 38 MRSA §488, sub-§§1, 2 and 3, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 714, are repealed.
	STATEMENT OF FACT
	This bill repeals the portion of the site location law that exempts road construction from review.
	The site location law requires review of developments which may substantially affect the

environment." Construction of roads, including logging roads, often involves large projects. These projects may include moving thousands of cubic yards of fill, and may affect hundreds of acres of land. Road construction directly affects the environment; sedimentation lowers water quality and fish production. Roads also indirectly affect the environment. Access created by new roads in remote areas can radically alter the character of the area. This bill requires roads in the organized and unorganized areas of the State that occupy more than 3 acres of land to be subject to this review.

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
