- 2. Provision of apprenticeship agreements. The commissioner shall cooperate with the Bureau of Labor program established pursuant to Title 26, section 1010, to provide apprenticeship agreements exclusively for the training and education of recipients of Aid to Families with Dependent Children.
- 3. Listing of state positions subject to apprenticeship agreements. By December 31, 1983, the commissioner shall review a list of apprenticeable state positions, provided by the Bureau of Labor and jointly with the Bureau of Labor, to establish a list of these positions which shall be subject to apprentice agreements.
- 4. Entry into apprenticeship agreements. By
 December 31, 1985, the commissioner shall enter
 apprenticeship agreements with Aid to Families with
 Dependent Children recipients for 10% of all positions from the list developed with the Bureau of
 Labor pursuant to subsection 3, which become vacant
 before that date.
- 5. Collective bargaining agreements. Nothing in this section may operate to invalidate or supersede the rights of any employee covered by a collective bargaining agreement between an employee organization and the State.
- Sec. 2. 26 MRSA §1012, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 512, §18, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

29 §1012. Coordination

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- 1. Procedures to be established. The State
 Apprenticeship and Training Council shall establish
 procedures for the coordination of programs developed
 under this subchapter with the Maine Aid to Families
 with Dependent Children Coordinating Committee established in Title 22, section 3773.
 - 2. Bureau of Labor to assist in development of apprenticeship programs and agreements. The Bureau of Labor shall assist in the development of the apprenticeship program and apprentice agreements between the Commissioner of Personnel and recipients

3		ST	ATEMENT OF FAC	T.		

The 110th Legislature established a program within the Bureau of Labor to establish apprenticeship agreements for recipients of Aid to Families with Dependent Children benefits. Many apprenticable occupations exist within State Government and there is presently no apprenticeship program within state service.

This bill proposes to reserve a certain number of positions which are determined "apprenticeable" as they become vacant for Aid to Families with Dependent Children recipients.

The Commissioner of Personnel is given broad discretion as to which jobs and under what conditions to create apprenticeships. No present employee's collective bargaining rights would be abridged by operation of this law.

No new job in state service would be created by this bill, rather apprenticeships would be established in existing positions as they become vacant.

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
