10 11	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
12 13 14 15 16 17	Sec. 1. Principles to apply only to certificate of need applications submitted after July 1, 1982. The principles of reimbursement for intermediate care facilities for the mentally retarded shall, with respect to new facilities, be applicable only to certificate of need applications submitted after July 1, 1982.
19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26	Sec. 2. Retention of incentive payment. The principles of reimbursement for intermediate care facilities for the mentally retarded shall provide for facilities to retain an incentive payment equal to 100% of the savings represented by the difference between the department's appropriate share of its allowable cost expenses and the amount paid by the department.
27 28 29	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
