STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill is needed to support the rotating collections of the Large Print Book Program. Since 1976, the Maine State Library has been circulating print books to public libraries and others throughout State. In turn, the public libraries circulate these books to their elderly and visually handicapped patrons. The program has grown considerably in past 7 years. Residents requiring large print books have increased to the point where the collection not large enough to serve their reading needs, nor is staff sufficient to meet their demands. Currently, the Maine State Library provides large print books to 90 public libraries, 50 nursing homes and over 3,000 individual borrowers. Additional will help to continue this much needed service.
