## STATEMENT OF FACT

2 The intent of this new draft is to place the 3 mandatory minimum prison sentences created by the 4 bill for furnishing or trafficking in drugs in the appropriate place in the Maine Criminal Code. 5 The 6 original bill placed the sentencing requirements in 7 sections of the code creating the substantive crimes. 8 This new draft adds the 10-day minimum sentence for 9 drug traffickers or furnishes to the sentencing 10 provisions of the Maine Criminal Code.

11 The new draft makes one addition to the list of 12 crimes in the original bill for which a mandatory 13 minimum sentence is established. The original bill include Title 17-A, section 1105 as a crime 14 did not 15 for which a minimum sentence would be required on 16 conviction. Title 17-A, section 1105, proscribing 17 aggravated trafficking or furnishing drugs, should be 18 included, and is in this new draft.
