STATEMENT OF FACT

4 This bill authorizes a school building committee 5 or school board to hire a clerk-of-the-works to over-6 see school construction. Presently, clerks-of-the-7 works are often representatives of architects, and 8 school districts are often unable to employ a person separate from the architect's representative and who 9 10 is more directly concerned with the school district's 11 interests. This bill allows a municipality or school district to hire a person completely unconnected with 12 architect and who is subject to approval by the 13 the Director of the Bureau of Public Improvements. 14 The clerk-of-the-works will promote and safeguard the 15 16 district's interest.
