	AN ACT to Establish a 30-Mile Evacuation Area around Nuclear Power Plants.
	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
	37-A MRSA §130 is enacted to read:
	§130. Thirty-mile emergency evacuation zone
	The area to be included in an emergency radiological response plan for any nuclear power reactor operating in or near this State shall include
	all municipalities or portions of municipalities that lie within a 30-mile radius of the facility.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to expand the size of the emergency evacuation zone covered by an emergency radiological response plan from a 10-mile radius to a 30-mile radius. Some federal agencies have recommended that these zones be expanded to this size. By making these changes, additional municipalities in the Wiscasset area around Maine Yankee will be included in emergency planning for a radiological accident at the plant.

This expansion will also ensure that municipalities in southern Maine within 30 miles of the Seabrook nuclear plant and municipalities in eastern Maine within 30 miles of Point Lepreau nuclear plant will be covered by an emergency plan.
