B. Intentionally or knowingly uses or attempts to use the contents of any wire or oral communication, knowing that the information was obtained through interception.

Information obtained from the use of a court authorized wire or oral interception in another state or jurisdiction may be used in any criminal or civil proceeding in this State.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Current law provides that information obtained by a legal court authorized wire interception in another state or country cannot be used as evidence in Maine. Presently, information is developed from time to time concerning smuggling operations which involve several states, resulting in arrests, seizures and confiscation of large sums of money in Maine. Without authority to use this type of evidence in Maine, moneys and other evidence must be turned over to federal agencies for seizure.
