event of the death, resignation or disability of the chairman, the commission may select, by a majority vote of its 8 remaining members, a new chairman. In the event that the commission is unable to select a chairman within 120 days of the death, resignation or disability, the Governor shall appoint an interim chairman for a period of one year or until such time as the commission selects a chairman in accordance with this section. The chairman shall be a full-voting member of the commission and, except when appointed for an interim term, shall serve for 4 years.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill renders all Maine residents eligible for the chairmanship of the Maine Indian Tribal-State Commission. Current law restricts the chairmanship to persons who are Retired Judges of the Superior Court or Supreme Judicial Court, the Retired Judges of the United States District Court for the District of Maine, or Retired Judges of the United States Court of Appeals for the First Circuit or the United States Supreme Court who are residents of Maine.
