IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE

AN ACT to Limit the Amount of Money Which Can Be Spent on Campaigns for the Maine Legislature.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

21 MRSA §I395-A is enacted to read:
§1395-A. Campaign spending limits on state legislative elections

No candidate for an elective state legislative office may exceed the campaign spending limits set out in this section. Campaign spending limits for primary and general elections for House and Senate candidates are as follows:

1. House candidates. Primary and general elections for the House: $\$ 1,500$ for each; and
2. Senate candidates. Primary and general elections for the Senate: $\$ 3,000$ for each.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill establishes campaign spending limits for Maine House and Senate primary and general election races. Because this new section is placed in Title 21, chapter 35, Campaign Reports and Finances, a violation of the spending limits is made a violation of the chapter. Violations of chapter 35 are Class E crimes.
