2 STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to make offsetting allocation transfers among highway accounts.

Insufficient allocations have been made to meet currently estimated requirements for the remainder of fiscal year 1983, in several highway accounts, including: Debt Service, Local Road Assistance and Administration. The total of the supplemental allocations required for these accounts is \$3,037,000.

It is possible to offset these increased allocation needs by taking advantage of cost savings accomplished in several other highway accounts including: Access Roads, Bridge Maintenance, the Salary Fund and Traffic Services. Therefore, corresponding reductions in allocations in these accounts totaling \$3,037,000 will result in no net change in total allocations.

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
