STATEMENT OF FACT

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At present, municipalities primarily enforce the state motor vehicle laws, but the State receives 100% of all fines obtained through enforcement of those laws. This bill provides an equitable sharing of all fines collected with 1/2 going to the municipality where the violation occurred, and 1/2 to the General Fund. The Highway Fund's share of these fines is not affected by this bill and remains as currently provided.

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
