2 STATEMENT OF FACT

The capital improvement aspect of this grant program was added in 1979 to complement a then active federal grant program. As such, the \$5,000 project ceiling was appropriate, as most projects over \$5,000 in cost included 50% federal funding. The diminishing federal funds coupled with the increased project costs due to inflation make the \$5,000 ceiling unrealistic.

This bill increases the project ceiling to \$25,000. Other legislation has been presented to provide continuing funding of this program and relieve the General Fund from biennial requests for funding.
