- Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §2401-A, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 569, §13, is amended to read:
- 11 Engineers and operators. A person holding 12 engineer's license issued under Title 26, section 13 178, or working under the general supervision of licensed while performing such oil or solid fuel 14 burner repair and maintenance as is necessary in steam or heating plant where he is employed, provided 16 17 such work is performed in compliance with section 18 2313 or a person employed by companies under 19 jurisdiction of the Public Utilities Commission or 20 the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission whose 21 facilities are subject to inspection under Title 26, 22 chapter 5, subchapter II, Article 4;
- Sec. 3. Effective 23 date. This Act shall take 24 effect January 1, 1984.

25 STATEMENT OF FACT

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In the course of an official investigation by the Public Utilities Commission into the circumstances surrounding a serious, yet avoidable, accident at the Wyman Unit No. 4, it was learned that operators of boilers owned by utilities are not required to be licensed. This bill corrects this situation and quires operator licensing by the Board of Boiler Rules and installation and repair licensing by the Oil and Solid Fuel Board.

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
