7 8	SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 884, L.D. 1138, Bill, "AN ACT to Increase the Minimum Wage."
9 10	Amend the bill by striking out all of the title and inserting in its place the following:
11 12	'AN ACT to Establish a Special Committee to Study the State's Minimum Wage.'
13 14	Further amend the bill by inserting before the enacting clause the following:
15 16 17	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
18 19	Whereas, the minimum wage has not been increased since 1981; and
20 21 22	Whereas, there are currently no efforts being made to increase the minimum wage on the federal level; and
23 24 25 26 27	Whereas, the standard of living of individuals and families living on minimum wage, and the impact of an increase in the minimum wage on the economic and business climate in the State warrant immediate investigation to seek a solution to this problem; and
28 29 30 31 32 33	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,'
34	Further amend the bill by striking out everything

- after the enacting clause and inserting in its place the following:
- 3 'Sec. 1. Committee established. A special committee is established to study the state's minimum 5 wage. The committee shall consist of the Senate 6 chairman of the Joint Standing Committee on Labor who 7 shall act as chairman of the committee; one member of the majority party and one member of the minority party in the Senate, appointed by the President of 8 9 10 Senate; one member of the majority party and one member of the minority party in the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House of 11 12 13 Representatives; 2 representatives of small busi-14 nesses in the State, 2 representatives of large busi-15 in the State, 2 representatives of employees 16 in the State who are members of a labor union and 2 17 representatives of employees in the State who are not 18 members of a labor union, all appointed by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of 19 20 Representatives, jointly; and one representative from 21 the Department of Labor, appointed by the Commis-22 sioner of Labor.
- Sec. 2. Reimbursement of expenses. The members of the committee shall serve without compensation, but may be reimbursed for their reasonable expenses.
- Sec. 3. Minimum wage study. The committee shall study the state minimum wage. This study shall include, but not be limited to the study of:
- A. The impact of an increase in the state minimum wage on the state's economy;
- 31 B. Whether an increase in the minimum wage would 32 result in increased unemployment;
- C. Whether individuals and families are able to exist on the current minimum wage; and
- 35 D. What effect previous minimum wage increases

1 2	have had on the economy, the unemployment rate and the standard of living within the State.
3 4 5 6 7 8	Sec. 4. Report. The committee shall report its findings to the Legislative Council for introduction at the Second Regular Session of the 111th Legislature prior to the convening of that session, together with final draft copies of any proposed legislation which the committee may recommend.'
9 10	Further amend the bill by inserting before the Statement of Fact the following:
11 12 13	'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.'
14	STATEMENT OF FACT
15 16 17	This amendment adds an emergency preamble and clause to the bill, and it eliminates the proposed minimum wage increase.
18 19 20 21 22	The purpose of this amendment is to establish a committee to study the state minimum wage, including any historical and projected impacts an increase in the minimum wage has, and to report its findings and any proposed changes to the Second Regular Session of the 111th Legislature.
