21 22	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
23 24	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6001, sub-§38-A is enacted to read:
25	38-A. Seaweed. "Seaweed" means all marine algae.
26 27	Sec. 2. 12 MRSA $\S6801$, as amended by PL 1981, c. 480, $\S7$, is repealed.
28	Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §6802 is enacted to read:
29	§6802. Seaweed permit

1 2 3 4 5	1. Permit required. It is unlawful for any person to engage in the activities authorized by the permit under this section without a current seaweed permit or other license issued under this Part authorizing the activities.
6 7 8 9	2. Other licenses. The holder of a current marine worm dealer or wholesale seafood license may engage in the activities authorized under this section without paying any additional fees.
10 11 12 13	3. Permitted activities. The holder of a seaweed permit may take seaweed or possess, ship, transport or sell seaweed that he has harvested for commercial purposes.
14 15 16 17	4. Supplemental permit. An employee or immediate relation of the holder of a current seaweed permit may obtain a supplemental permit to engage in the activities authorized by this section.
18	5. Fee. The fee for a seaweed permit is:
19	A. \$3 for a resident;
20	B. \$25 for a nonresident; and
21	C. \$1 for a supplemental permit.
22	STATEMENT OF FACT
23 24 25 26 27	This new draft exempts holders of marine worm dealers and wholesale seafood licenses from the requirement to obtain a seaweed permit. The bill also provides \$1 supplemental permits and reduces the fee for a resident permit from \$13 to \$3.
