	ster traps in any of the coastal waters of this State than the maximum number allowed under this section.
	1. Maximum traps for 1984. The maximum number
	of lobster traps for 1984 shall be 800.
	2. Decreasing maximum number. Each year after
	1984, the maximum number of lobster traps allowed

1	shall be reduced by 50 until the maximum number of
2	lobster traps reaches 600.
