17 18 19	AN ACT to Establish Day Care Services for State Employees.
20 21	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
22	22 MRSA §8306 is enacted to read:
23	§8306. Day care program
24 25 26 27 28 29	1. Establishment of program. The state shall establish a day care program for children of state employees. The program shall be licensed in accor- dance with the provisions of this chapter and under the direction of a designee of the commissioner, who shall be called the director.
30 31 32 33	The program shall be located in state-owned or state-leased facilities in the Augusta area, and shall be open between at least 7:00 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. Monday to Friday.

- 1 The fees charged shall be sufficient to cover the 2 expenses of operation.
- 2. Eligibility. The commissioner shall promulgate rules, in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, for employees' eligibility for this program. The rules shall
 include, but not limited to:
- 8 A. The number of children each employee may 9 enroll;
- 10 B. The ages of the children; and
- 11 C. The fees for the program.

12 <u>3. Report. The program shall be evaluated by</u> 13 <u>the director, who shall, by December of 1984, submit</u> 14 <u>to the joint standing committees having jurisdiction</u> 15 <u>over appropriations and financial affairs and health</u> 16 <u>and institutional services a report on the program's</u> 17 operation.

- 18 The committees shall each review the report, hold 19 public hearings on the report, and make recommenda-20 tions in the form of legislation as to whether the 21 program shall continue.
- 224. Repeal. This section shall be repealed on23June 30, 1985.
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STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill establishes a day care program for children of state employees, and provides for a review of the program's operation after a year. Unless the report recommends continuation of the program, it will end in June, 1985.

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
