Sec. 2. Commission established. There is hereby created the Commission on the Financial Needs ofMaine Small Businesses to consist of 15 members: Managers of the Veterans and Maine Small Business Loan Authority and the Maine Guarantee Authority; the Director of the State Development Office; the Director of the State Planning Office; a representative of Small Business Administration; a representative from the Maine Bankers' Association; a representative from the Maine Savings Bank Association; sentative of the Governor's office; 3 members of the small business community to be appointed by the Governor; and 4 Economic Development Directors representing the various geographic regions of the State, be appointed by the Governor. The Governor shall designate the chairman of the commission.

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- Sec. 3. Subjects of study. The Commission on the Financial Needs of Maine Small Businesses shall investigate and study the total scope of financial needs of Maine small businesses, including, but not limited to, the following:
 - A. The effectiveness of the present system of providing financial assistance to Maine small businesses, including, but not limited to:
 - (1) The appropriateness of the present loan ceilings;
 - (2) The paper work required to submit a loan application;
 - (3) The response time of state agencies to requests for financial assistance; and
 - (4) The level of coordination existing among the various state and federal agencies providing financial assistance or advice to Maine small businesses;
 - B. The issue of loan guarantees versus direct loans;
 - C. The definition of "small business" and whether or not the term needs redefining;
