29	STATEMENT OF FACT
30 31 32 33 34	The Town of Harrison over the past several year has entered into a contract with Cumberland County for police services. The town does not have its own police force. In order to ensure full-time coverage by a deputy sheriff, the town in effect hires a dep-

uty from the sheriff's department. The contracts have been "at cost" of the county. The county sheriff each year presents the town with a statement of costs for the next year's services showing line item charges. A contract is entered into between the county and town on the basis of the statement of costs.

In 1980, the Town of Harrison paid \$2,368.86 for retirement benefits. The money was paid to the county under a contract with the Town of Harrison and it was unexpended, as the deputy involved was not participating in the retirement system. The town had no knowledge of this until now.

This resolve authorizes the county commissioners to reimburse the Town of Harrison \$2,368.86 for these retirement charges.
