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1 2 3 4 5 6	The Legislature finds that there are many uncer- tain future costs associated with nuclear power plants, including the costs of low-level and high-level waste disposal, decommissioning and long- term care. These costs shall be borne by the consum- ers.
7	The Legislature finds that citizens are concerned
8	about the possible health, safety and environmental
9	effects associated with nuclear power plants, due to
10	routine air emissions or other sources.
11	The purpose of this subchapter is to provide for
12	citizen participation in any decision to construct a
13	nuclear power plant within the State.
14	§3382. Referendum
15	Prior to the construction of any nuclear power
16	plant within the State, the question of approving
17	that construction shall be submitted to the voters of
18	the State in the manner prescribed by law for holding
19	a statewide election. This question shall be submit-
20	ted to the legal voters of the State at the next fol-
21	lowing statewide election. The city aldermen, town
22	selectmen and plantation assessors of this State
23	shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cit-
24	ies, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner
25	prescribed by law for holding a statewide election,
26	to vote on the acceptance or rejection of construc-
27	tion by voting on the following question:
28	"Shall the nuclear power plant proposed for con-
29	struction at (insert location)
30	be approved for construction?"
31	The legal voters of each city, town and
32	plantation shall vote by ballot on this question and
33	shall designate their choice by a cross or check mark
34	placed within a corresponding square below the words
35	"Yes" or "No." The ballots shall be received,
36	sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and
37	plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary
38	of State in the same manner as votes for members of
39	the Legislature. The Governor shall review the
40	return and, if it appears that a majority of the
41	legal votes are in favor of construction, the Gover-
42	nor shall proclaim that fact without delay.

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1	The Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish
2	to each city, town and plantation all ballots,
3	returns and copies of this subchapter necessary to
4	carry out the purpose of this referendum.
5	§3383. Prohibition; effective date of certificate of
6	public convenience and necessity
7	Construction shall not commence on any nuclear
8	power plant within the State without approval by the
9	voters as prescribed in section 3382. No certificate
10	of public convenience and necessity issued by the
11	commission, under section 13-A or 13-B for such a
12	plant, may be effective without approval by the
13	voters as prescribed in section 3382.
14	STATEMENT OF FACT
15	The purpose of this bill is to provide for citi-
16	zen participation in the decision to construct any
17	nuclear power plant, as described more fully in the
18	findings and purpose, Title 35, section 3381.

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
