29	§3488. Placement							

When it has been determined, as a part of the adult protective services process, that an incapacitated or dependent adult who is not retarded is in need of placement in a nonmedical licensed or approved facility and the cost of placement, in whole or in part, is state funded, the adult shall be assessed prior to placement for the purpose of identifying the needed level of care.

§3489. Levels

There shall be 4 levels of care available for dependent or incapacitated adults who are adult protective services clients and who are not mentally retarded.

- 1. Level one. The adult presents no significant management problems, but has activity of daily living needs beyond care and maintenance to preserve or improve physical and intellectual functioning and independence.
- 2. Level 2. The adult may exhibit signs and symptoms of mental illness controlled by appropriate treatment or have diagnosed problems in social or emotional functioning which require activities aimed at maintaining or improving levels of functioning to achieve maximum independence and accepted participation in community life.
- 3. Level 3. The adult may exhibit inappropriate social and emotional behavior and may intermittently present self-abusive, destructive or aggressive behavior requiring specialized care and supervision.
- 4. Level 4. The adult presents significant mental health, substance abuse or multiple problems and is in need of intensive services or intervention to stabilize placement.

34 §3490. Therapeutic services

In addition to basic care and maintenance, a group of alternative care services, including therapeutic services provided by the facility staff to level 3 and level 4 clients, may be purchased, which will implement specific objectives to maximize

- 5 There shall be a multidisciplinary training team 6 for the purpose of providing ongoing training for the 7 facility staff and placement workers.

8 §3492. Rules

- The department may adopt rules in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II, to carry out this chapter.

22 STATEMENT OF FACT

The new draft clarifies that the bill applies to nonretarded clients of the Department of Human Services who are receiving protective services and specifies how the characteristics of the client should correlate with the level of care to be provided.

The Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 3490 provides for the purchase of therapeutic services, with rates established by regulations of the department, not by statute.

The training team is to represent several departments and programs.
