STATEMENT OF FACT

6 This new draft corrects the original bill, which 7 provided for collection of damages under the "fees and costs" provision of the unfair trade practices 8 law. This new draft places that provision in the sub-9 10 section which deals with the remedies which are generally available to the consumer. It also clari-11 fies that the ability to seek damages under this 12 13 provision does not include punitive or exemplary dam-14 ages.

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
