17 18 19 20	AN ACT to Clarify the Authority and Responsibility of School Boards in Disciplining Students.
21 22	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
23 24 25	20-A MRSA §1001, sub-§9, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 693, §§5 and 8, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
26 27 28	9. Discipline of students. They shall have authority to govern schools and discipline students within their jurisdiction as follows.
29 30 31 32 33	A. They shall adopt rules not inconsistent with law setting forth standards of student conduct and grounds for discipline of students which may include expulsion from school, suspension from school or any program within the school and other disciplinary measures.

School board rules shall establish procedures for investigation of student behavior, decisions on discipline in accordance with due process. The board shall inform students of the rules affecting them and shall notify parents annually of existence of the rules and the availability of copies.

- B. They shall expell any student who is deliberately disobedient or deliberately disorderly or for infractions of violence or possession, furnishing or trafficking of any scheduled drug, as defined in Title 17-A, chapter 45, if found necessary for the peace and usefulness of the school.
- C. They shall readmit any student who has been expelled on satisfactory evidence that the behavior which was the cause for expulsion will not likely recur.
- D. They may suspend students from school or any program within the school or otherwise discipline any student for such periods of time as is believed necessary for the efficient government of the school.
- E. They may authorize the principal to suspend students from the school or any program within the school for a maximum time of 10 days for infraction of school board rules.

STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill clarifies the authority and duty of local school boards in matters of student discipline and requires them to adopt rules and implement discipline in accordance with due process principles.

The bill requires school boards to adopt the rules which are the basis for any student discipline. It clearly establishes that rules may include a variety of penalties including suspension and expulsion. It also allows suspension from programs within the school, in accordance with appropriate procedures. Under this bill students may be suspended from an
