21 STATEMENT OF FACT

2.2 The United States Environmental Protection, recognizing that programs being administered by the 23 Bureau of Air Quality Control were so 24 substantial initial grant funding was inadequate, has 25 that increased its fiscal year 1983 grant. This increase will allow the Bureau of Air Quality Control to meet 26 27 its obligations under the United States Public Law 28 95-95, Section 105, as amended. Funds involved in 29 30 this increased allocation have already been added to the Letter of Credit 68-13-0102 and will, therefore, 31 involve no increase in state funds. 32

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
