If a person's license or permit is suspended prior to trial under this section and the person is subsequently found not guilty of the violation on which the suspension is based, the court shall, upon request by that person, determine what reasonable damages, if any, have been suffered by that person as a direct result of the suspension and may order that these damages be paid by the State. Any damages which the court may order paid by the State shall be paid by the Treasurer of State in accordance with Title 5, section 1512.
23	STATEMENT OF FACT
24 25 26 27	The purpose of this amendment is to provide for the payment of reasonable damages to a person whose license is suspended when that person is later found not guilty of the violation of offense.
