28	When approval of legislation by an Indian tribe
29	or Indian nation is required by the United States
30	Code, Title 25, Section 1725(e), certification of
31	that approval shall be made to the Secretary of State

by the officer of the affected Indian tribe or Indian nation designated in section 602. The certification shall state the date and manner of approval of the legislation and shall be prima facie evidence of approval. The Secretary of State shall forthwith transmit certified copies of the certification of approval to the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives.

## §602. Designation of officer

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The governor and council of the Penobscot Nation, the Joint Tribal Council of the Passamaquoddy Tribe shall each designate, by name and title, the officer authorized to execute the certificate of approval of legislation required by section 601. designation shall be in writing and filed with Secretary of State no later than the first Wednesday in January in the First Regular Session of the Legislature. The Secretary of State shall forthwith transmit certified copies of each designation to the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives. The designation shall remain in effect until the governor and council of the Penobscot Nation or the Joint Tribal Council of the Passamaquoddy Tribe make a new designation.

Sec. 2. Effective date. This Act shall not be effective unless, within 60 days of the adjournment of the Legislature, the Secretary of State receives written certification by the Joint Tribal Council of Passamaquoddy Tribe and the governor and council of the Penobscot Nation that the respective tribe and nation have agreed to the provisions of this Act pursuant to the United States Code, Title 25, Section 1725(e) (1), copies of which shall be submitted by the Secretary of State to the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives; provided that in no event may this Act become effective until 90 days after adjournment of the Legislature.

	This bill sets out the procedure to be followed by the Penobscot Nation and Passamaquoddy Tribe in giving their approval to legislation which amends the Maine Indian Claims Settlement Act.
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
