23 Sec. 4. Adjustments to allocations. Allocations 24 may be increased or adjusted by the State Budget 25 Officer with the approval of the Governor to specifi-26 cally cover those adjustments determined to be necessary under any salary plan approved by the Legis-27 28 lature and those reclassifications/range changes 29 which have been approved by the Department of Personnel and submitted for legislative review prior to the 30 31 effective date of this Act.
