19 AN ACT Making Additional Allocations for
20 the Expenditures of State Government in
21 Response to United States Emergency Jobs
22 and Humanitarian Aid Programs for the Fiscal
23 Year Ending June 30, 1984.

25 Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis-
26 lature do not become effective until 90 days after
27 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

28 Whereas, the 90-day period will not terminate
29 until after the beginning of the next fiscal year;
30 and

31 Whereas, certain previously unanticipated reve-
32 nues are expected to be made available to the State
33 by the Federal Government as a result of the United
34 States Emergency Jobs and Humanitarian Aid Programs
35 authorized by Public Law 98.8, prior to the end of
36 the 90-day period; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Additional block grant authorizations and allocations.

A. In accordance with the Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1670, the State may accept federal block grants related to United States Emergency Jobs and Humanitarian Aid Programs in the following amounts in addition to such sums as have been otherwise authorized:
