IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE
AN ACT to Amend Certain Provisions of the Sunday Closing Law.
Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
Whereas, the recently enacted provision allowing retail establishments to remain open on certain Sundays is now in effect; and
Whereas, the holiday season is imminent; and
Whereas, unless this legislation is enacted as an emergency, many Maine citizens will be deprived of the observance of important holidays; and
Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following

- legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now,

- 4 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- 6 17 MRSA §3204, first ¶, as amended by PL 1983, c. 7 156, is further amended to read:

No person, firm or corporation may, on the Lord's Day Sunday, except between the hours of noon and 5:00 5 p.m. on those Sundays falling between Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day; Memorial Day, the last Monday in May, but if the United States Government designates May 30th as the date for observance of Memorial or in 1985, whichever occurs first in time, the 30th of May; July 4th; Labor Day, the first Monday of September; Veterans Day, November 11th; Christmas Day, December 25th; and Thanksgiving Day as proclaimed by the Governor, the last Thursday in November, keep open a place of business to the public, except for works of necessity, emergency or charity. When any one of the holidays named in this paragraph, Sundays, falls on a Sunday, the Monday than following shall be observed as a holiday, so that the prohibition of this paragraph shall apply to both the Sunday and the Monday following.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

29 STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to amend the Sunday closing law by designating Christmas Day as December 25th, by designating Thanksgiving as the last Thursday in November and by causing the Monday following any of the named holidays which may fall on a Sunday to be observed as a holiday for purposes of the law.
