23 24 25 26	D. In addition to hazardous waste identified under subsection 1, paragraph A, the Legislature identifies the following chemicals, materials, substances or waste as being hazardous waste:
27 28 29 30 31 32 33	(1) Polychlorinated biphenyls and any substance containing polychlorinated biphenyls in a concentration of 50 parts per million or greater, provided that the polychlorinated biphenyls or the substance containing polychlorinated biphenyls is not in active service.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill includes polychlorinated biphenyls within the definition of a hazardous waste in Maine, although polychlorinated biphenyls are not currently classified as a hazardous waste by the United States Environmental Protection Agency. Devices, such as transformers or capacitors which contain polychlorinated biphenyls but are currently in service and functioning properly, are excluded from regulation until such time when they are taken out of service or fail to operate properly.

It is estimated that additional revenue between \$3,000 and \$10,000 will accrue to the Maine Hazardous Waste Fund during fiscal year 1985 as a result of this action.
