	AN ACT Concerning Repeal of Commercial Fishing for Atlantic Salmon in the St. Croix River.
	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
(12 MRSA §6553, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 561, §5, is repealed.
	STATEMENT OF FACT
N H	This section of the Atlantic salmon statutes re- lates to the authorized taking of Atlantic salmon in weirs in the St. Croix River from May 15th to August 31st. This statute is inconsistent with the general law governing salmon fishing in coastal waters which prohibits the taking of salmon except by hook and line from July 16th to October 15th.

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1 The Atlantic Sea Run Salmon Commission, in coop-2 eration with the Canadian Department of Fisheries and 3 Oceans, is attempting to reestablish a salmon run in 4 the St. Croix River. To accomplish this purpose, both 5 Canada and Maine have been stocking Atlantic salmon 6 in the St. Croix River. A new fishway was constructed 7 at Milltown, New Brunswick by the New Brunswick Elec-8 tric Power Commission in October, 1981. Improved wa-9 ter quality and fishways in all the main stem dams 10 allow Atlantic salmon access to the headwaters of the 11 Croix River. There is no commercial fishing al-St. 12 lowed for salmon on the Canadian side of the St. River. Repeal of this section of the statute 13 Croix 14 allows for greater escapement of salmon to headwater 15 spawning areas in order to reestablish a native salm-16 on run on the St. Croix River.

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
