30	STATEMENT OF FACT
31 32	In a number of cases within the past several years, local school units have wished to purchase

small parcels of land at modest costs. Current law requires an expensive and time-consuming referendum vote plus State Board of Education approval to accomplish this.

The intent of this bill is to permit a local administrative unit to purchase land not in conjunction with a school construction project without undergoing the time and expense of a referendum vote and State Board of Education approval.

All costs involved would be paid totally with local funds.

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
