AN ACT to Amend the Statute Governing the Licensing of Child Placing Agencies.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
$22\ MRSA\ \S8201$, as enacted by PL 1975, c. 719, §6, is amended to read:
§8201. Definition of child placing agency
As used in this subtitle, the term "child placing agency" shall mean means a facility which advertises itself or holds itself out as finding homes for or otherwise placing children under the age of 16 18, in
homes where care is provided on a 24-hour day basis.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill has 2 purposes. First, it makes consistent the definition of child placing agency in regard to age of children placed with the existing requirements for the facilities into which the children are placed. Secondly, it makes clear that the definition of child placing agency applies only to placement for 24-hour care as opposed to placement for day care.

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
