15 16 17 18 19	3. Ex officio corporators. Ex officio corporators shall consist of the heads of the major state departments and agencies and the Chancellor of the University of Maine. State department and agency heads shall include the following:

21	Director of the State Planning Office;

23 24	Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources;
25 26	Commissioner of Business, Occupational and Professional Regulation;

16	STATEMENT OF FACT
17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24	The Finance Authority of Maine was created by the 111th Legislature to consolidate the state's financial programs, replacing among other agencies, the Maine Guarantee Authority. This bill makes it possible for the Chief Executive Officer of Finance Authority of Maine, as successor to the Manager of the Maine Guanantee Authority, to serve as an ex officio corporator of the Maine Development Foundation.
