21 22	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine a follows:
23 24 25 26	Sec. 1. Annual profile. Allowances and policie adopted by the Department of Human Services for medical equipment and supplies for Medicaid recipient shall be subject to the following provisions.
27 28	1. All allowances and policies shall be based upon an annual profile compiled by the department.
29 30 31	A. The profile shall list all separate medical equipment and supply items, including rentals reimbursed in the previous year.
32 33	B. The profile allowances shall be determined as an average of all prices billed the department

over the course of the year for each separate item of medical equipment or supply.

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- C. No allowance may exceed the equivalent allowance provided by Medicare in its current profile.
- All billings to the Department of Human Services shall be based upon usual and customary charges.
- 8 3. The department shall establish a medical equipment and supply advisory committee, representing Maine companies, to review, comment upon and otherwise assist as appropriate, in the development of the annual profile.
- Sec. 2. Applicability. The first profile established shall be in effect October 1, 1984, and shall be based upon billings in the period of April 1, 1984, through August 31, 1984. The 2nd profile shall be in effect July 1, 1985, and each profile thereafter shall be annually.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill is designed to establish a simple and fair method of reimbursing medical equipment and supplies provided to Medicaid recipients. On December 1, 1983, the Department of Human Services implemented new policies that severely reduce reimbursements for wheelchairs and often items, to levels far below what is reasonable and fair. This bill will set up an annual profile, or schedule, of reimbursements that is based upon actual billings reflective of true costs.

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
