19 20 21 22	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 12 MRSA §7901, sub-§1-A, as enacted by PL 1983,

A violation of section 7371, subsection 3, is a Class E crime, provided that, in addition to any fine imposed, the convicted person shall be subject to a fine penalty of not less than twice the applicable license fee, this fee not to be suspended.
30 31 32	STATEMENT OF FACT The purpose of this bill is to clarify the law concerning hunting without a license. The bill pro-

vides that in addition to the fine imposed, the convicted person must pay a penalty equal to twice the license fee he would have paid if he had obtained a license.
