1 Martel of Sanford. Her husband had 23 years, 9 2 months and 4 days creditable service as an employee 3 of the Town of Sanford in the Maine State Retirement 4 System. When the Town of Sanford became a participa-5 ting local district in the Maine State Retirement System, it chose to grant prior service credit for 6 only 50% of the time its employees had worked for the 7 town. Had 60% or more been granted, Mr. Martel would have had 25 years of creditable service to his cred-8 9 10 it, which would have entitled his widow to a continuing monthly benefit instead of only a refund of the contributions he had made. 11 12

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
