23 24 25	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
26 27	Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate un- til after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and
28 29 30	Whereas, the Office of Energy Resources has re- ceived a federal grant to undertake a biomass conver- sion project of state facilities; and
31 32 33 34	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-

vation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

20 This bill allows the Office of Energy Resources 21 to spend a \$30,000 grant from the Coalition of North-22 east Governors received in January. The money will be used to study the feasibility of biomass conversions at several state buildings and the use of alternative 23 24 25 financing for those projects.
