Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Preamble. Two-thirds of both Houses of Legislature deeming it necessary in accordance with section 14 of Article IX of the Constitution to reallocate bonds on behalf of the State of Maine to provide for capital improvements, construction, renovations, equipment and furnishings for state parks.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Previously authorized bonds. Private and Special Law 1971, chapter 140, section 6, authorized bonds in the amount of \$2,392,500 for capital improvements for state parks. This bond issue was ratified by the voters of the State on June 19, 1972. Of this amount, \$1,989,500 in bonds have been issued and \$403,000 of the bonds remain unsold. The following is a tabulation of the activity within this bond issue.

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40 41 Sec. 5. Other provisions of Private and Special Law 1971, chapter 140, unaffected. If this Act is approved by the voters, all other provisions of Private and Special Law 1971, chapter 140, are unaffected and remain in effect.

Sec. 6. Statutory referendum procedure; submission at general election; form of quiestion; effective date. This Act shall be submitted to the legal voters of the State of Maine at the next general election in the month of November following passage of this Act. The city aldermen, town selectmen and plantation assessors of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, to vote on the acceptance or rejection of this Act by voting on the following question:

"Shall \$350,000 of the unused funds appropriated for state park improvements in 1971 be used for improvements at Colonial Pemaguid in Bristol?"

The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question, and shall designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within a corresponding square below "Yes" or "No." The ballots shall be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes are in favor of the Act, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay, and the Act shall become effective 30 days after the date of the proclamation.

The Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this Act necessary to carry out the purpose of this referendum.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited

in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

3 STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill authorizes the reallocation of \$350,000 of previously authorized but unsold bonds for state park improvements. These funds would be realized by transferring \$142,500 from the Acquisition line, \$60,000 from Damariscotta Lake, \$145,000 from Tyler Pond and \$2,500 from Popham Beach. These funds are needed for the development of visitor and interpretive facilities at Colonial Pemaquid, which is deemed to be of higher priority. The other changes in dollar amounts reflect transfers authorized by the Governor as allowed in Private and Special Law 1971, chapter 140, section 6.

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
