The Department of Corrections, the Department of Educational and Cultural Services, the Department of Human Services and the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation shall coordinate to the greatest extent possible their goals, education, treatment, training, prevention and research programs. Before expending any educational and training funds, a department shall submit the plans for the program to the Alcohol and Drug Planning Committee established by the Legislature to ensure coordination of policy and service.		
36	Sec. 3. Accountability. The Alcohol	and Drug	

- 1 Planning Committee shall report to the Legislature on 2 or before the first day of each regular session of 3 the Legislature the actions taken by the departments 4 pursuant to the allocations made from this fund. report shall include a description of each program 5 6 and actions taken expending funds for alcoholism pre-7 vention, training, education, treatment and research. The funds expended shall be identified as to source 8 9 whether federal, state or private grants. In addi-10 tion, the committee shall provide a report on drug 11 abuse, including a description of all programs and expenditures of all funds. The reports may include 12 13 recommendations and outline issues which the Legislature and the departments and the committee may wish 14 15 to address.
  - Sec. 4. Adjustments to allocations. Allocations may be increased or adjusted by the State Budget Officer with the approval of the Governor to specifically cover those adjustments determined to be necessary under any salary plan approved by the Legislature and those reclassifications and range changes which have been approved by the Department of Personnel and submitted for legislative review prior to the effective date of this Act.
- 25 Sec. 5. Encumbered balances at year end. At the 26 end of each fiscal year, all encumbered balances 27 shall not be carried more than once.
- 28 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited 29 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect July 1, 30 1984.
