## STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this new draft is to increase the allocation from the Highway Fund to the Local Road Assistance Program by an amount determined by the 112th Legislature. The increase is effective on April 1, 1985. The increase is based on the surplus available at the time in the Highway Fund and on projections of Highway Fund revenues.
