## STATEMENT OF FACT

This new draft is required to bring the AFDC Standard of Need closer to the actual present cost of providing for children's needs. The present Standard of Need is estimated to represent a 1974 standard of living. The increase of 5% which has been appropriated for the 2nd year of the budget is expected to just cover the rate of inflation in the past year. That budgeted increase will therefore not overcome the severe effects of past inflation which have eroded the purchasing power of AFDC grants faster than all previous increases. This bill proposes an additional increase to begin to close that gap.

The urgent nature of this new draft is underscored by the findings and recommendations of the Special Advisory Committee on Children's Deaths in Maine, which recognizes that major increases in the AFDC Standard of Need are needed to protect poor children from serious risks to their health and safety.

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
