AN ACT to Clarify the Use of Vocational-  
technical Institutes' Facilities by  
Others.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §10104, sub-§2, ¶D, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 693, §§5 and 8, is amended to read:

D. Charge tuition and other reasonable fees, including fees for the reasonable use of the institutes' facilities by others;

Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §10104, sub-§2, ¶F, as amended by PL 1983, c. 422, §19, is further amended to read:

F. Accept and expend all funds for post-secondary vocational education received by the department from:

(1) The General Fund;

1 (2) Gifts and donations either from public  
2 or private sources which are offered uncon-  
3 ditionally or under conditions approved by  
4 the State Board; or

5 (3) Fees charged pursuant to paragraph D.

7 STATEMENT OF FACT

8 This bill clarifies that the State Board of Edu-  
9 cation has the authority to make the  
10 vocational-technical institute facilities available  
11 to other parties for a fee, and that those fees are  
12 included within the term "fees" set forth in Title  
13 20, section 2263, subsection 2, paragraphs D and F  
14 and Title 20-A, section 10104, subsection 2, para-  
15 graphs D and F.
