"Board of trustees" means 9 the board of trustees of the department. 10 2. Department. "Department" means the Department of Post-secondary Vocational-technical Education. 11 12 §12502. Department established There is established the Department of Post-secondary Vocational-technical Education which 13 14 15 shall be governed by a board of trustees. The depart-16 ment shall be a state agency and shall consist of the 17 office of commissioner and the 6 vocational-technical 18 institutes. 19 §12503. Mission The mission of Maine's vocational-technical in-20 21 stitutes is to provide associate degree, diploma certificate programs directed at educational, occupa-22 tional and technical needs of Maine's citizens and 23 24 the manpower needs of Maine's employers. 25 §12504. Board of trustees 26 Membership. The board of trustees shall consist of 7 members: 27 28 A. Three from the field of business and indus-29 try; 30 B. Two from the field of education; 31 C. One from the field of health service; and

 - 2. Appointment; terms. Members of the board of trustees shall be appointed by the Governor for staggered 4-year terms, subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education and to confirmation by the Legislature. No classified or unclassified employee of the State or person who holds elected state office may serve on the board of trustees. Vacancies on the board of trustees shall be filled for the unexpired term only. A member shall serve until a successor has been appointed and qualified.
- 3. Compensation. Members shall serve without compensation, but may be reimbursed for their expenses.
- 4. Chairman. One member of the board shall be designated by the Governor as chairman. The chairman shall be the spokesman for the board.
- 19 §12505. Duties of the board of trustees
- The board shall:

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- 21 1. Policy. Develop and adopt policy for the de-22 partment and its institutions;
- 23 2. Administration. Oversee the administration of the department and its institutions;
- 3. Funds. Except as otherwise provided in this
 Title, apply for and receive, in the same manner as
 other state agencies, federal and other funds for the
 operation of the department and its institutions. The
 board may accept gifts of money and property, other
 than real property, for use in institutional programs
 on its own authority; and

- The Governor shall appoint a Commissioner of Post-secondary Vocational-technical Education who 1 2 shall be the chief executive officer of the depart-3 ment, subject to review by the joint standing commit-4 tee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education and confirmation by the Legislature. The com-5 6 7 missioner shall be qualified by education and experience and shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor. 8 salary of the commissioner shall be that estab-9 lished in Title 2, section 6, subsection 5. 10
- 11 §12507. Cooperation with other agencies
- The commissioner shall be responsible for promoting cooperation and communication between the department and the board and the Department of Educational and Cultural Services, and between the department and the university system of the State.

- The commissioner shall establish an administrative board composed of the presidents of the 6 vocational-technical institutes. The commissioner shall serve as chairman of the administrative board which shall advise him in the performance of his duties under this chapter.

- The commissioner shall, subject to approval by the board of trustees, appoint presidents of the 6 vocational-technical institutes. Presidents shall be qualified by education and experience.

- The president of each vocational-technical institute in the department shall appoint deans, with the approval of the board of trustees and subject to the appropriations made for those positions.

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17 The vocational-technical institutes may seek accreditation and maintain membership in the regional 18 19 accrediting association, satisfy the requirements 20 necessary to achieve and maintain regional accreditation as vocational-technical institutes and meet the 21 22 requirements necessary for federal aid. Each program 23 of study offered shall meet all of the requirements 24 for professional accreditation or licensing of the 25 particular specialty.

§12513. Instructional personnel

The board of trustees shall conduct an examination of existing state personnel policies, rules and laws and the manner in which they apply to instructional personnel of the department. The board shall, by July 1, 1985, submit a report to the Legislature detailing modification in those policies needed to make them appropriate for instructional personnel, together with all necessary implementing legislation. In its review, the board of trustees shall seek the assistance of the Department of Personnel and representatives of the instructional personnel of the

- post-secondary vocational-technical institutes.
- 2 §12514. Loan fund revolving accounts

3 The board may establish and administer such loan 4 fund revolving accounts as may be approved by the 5 Governor to completely comply with all federal regu-6 lations and to effectively and efficiently operate 7 the loan programs within vocational-technical institutes. The board shall adopt rules pursuant to Title 8 9 5, chapter 375, for the giving of loans to students 10 in need of financial aid at the who are 11 vocational-technical institutes, the repayment of the loans or other requirements relative to the loans. 12 13 loan fund revolving account authorized and the 14 specific funds associated with it shall be kept in a 15 separate special account by the Treasurer of State, and any repayment of loans made from one of 16 17 separate special accounts shall be credited to that separate special account for continued use as a 18 19 fund.

§12515. Instructional Projects Revolving Fund

The department shall administer an Instructional Projects Revolving Fund to aid instruction at state vocational-technical institutes. The fund shall be used to pay necessary costs of projects which are carried out as part of the instructional program. No project may be undertaken unless the fund contains enough money to cover the proposed budget. All money generated through operation of any project shall be put into the fund, shall be continually appropriated for use in another instructional project and shall not lapse, except that the total money in the fund shall not exceed \$200,000. Any excess over this amount shall be paid into the General Fund.

§12516. Advisory committees

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40 41 The federally mandated and funded Maine Advisory Council on Vocational Education shall advise the board of trustees, presidents, commissioner and department. Each president shall appoint, subject, to approval by the board of trustees, a local advisory committee for that president's respective campus to advise the presidents, the commissioner and the board

of trustees on the operation of the vocational-technical institutes. The president may also appoint advisory committees to advise the institute president on the development and operation of specific academic programs at the vocational-technical institute.

Sec. 6. Transition provision. The Governor may appoint a commissioner and members to the board of trustees as of the effective date of this Act. The transitions provided for in this Act shall be accomplished in orderly stages and shall be completed by July 1, 1986. During this transition period, the board of trustees shall receive staff assistance from the Department of Educational and Cultural Services. Any expenses of the board of trustees during the period of transition shall be paid from funds available to the Department of Educational and Cultural Services.

18 STATEMENT OF FACT

 The purpose of this bill is to establish the Department of Post-secondary Vocational-technical Education. The organization of the department includes a commissioner and board of trustees appointed by the Governor, subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education and confirmation by the Senate. The 6 existing vocational-technical institutes within the State shall be integrated into the department.
