17 AN ACT to Prevent Discrimination  
18 Against Retired Maine Residents who  
19 have Previously been Members  
20 of the Maine State Retirement System.

22 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as  
23 follows:

24 5 MRSA §1123, as amended by PL 1979, c. 663, §§16  
25 and 17, is further amended by adding at the end a new  
26 paragraph to read:

27 Any person who is a recipient of a state retire-  
28 ment allowance and who is reemployed in any capacity  
29 in which he would otherwise be eligible to be a par-  
30 ticipating member of the system may, as of January 1,  
31 1983, become a member of the system provided that his  
32 new service entitles that person to new benefits.  
33 Any new benefits shall be only such benefits as one  
34 earned on the new service and shall not entitle any  
35 person so reemployed to statutory minimum benefits on  
36 that service, nor shall benefits earned previously be

1 recomputed because of the new service in the system.

2 STATEMENT OF FACT

3 The purpose of this bill is to permit persons who  
4 are receiving a state retirement allowance to become  
5 members of the Maine State Retirement System, if they  
6 are reemployed and entitled to new benefits.
