to their respective abilities. If an eligible person dies leaving any relative responsible under this paragraph, the overseer shall, upon application, determine what family resources are available to assume the cost, in whole or in part, of the burial expenses. The overseer shall render a written decision within 10 days of receipt of an application, and during that 10-day period shall attempt to locate all responsible parties and resources. If responsible family members refuse to allow the overseer to investigate their resources under this paragraph refuse to contribute to the burial costs if they appear able, as a result of an application, the municipality may initiate court action pursuant to section 4319.

- B. A municipality shall not accept full responsibility for burial expenses unless:
 - (1) All responsible family members demonstrate to the overseer's satisfaction their inability to pay, in full or in part, or make a deferred payment arrangement with the funeral director; and
 - (2) No other benefits or resources are available under any federal, state or other program that will provide full or partial payment for the burial, including, but not limited to, any death benefits under Social Security or any other program, or contributions from other persons.
- C. If payments from the responsible family members, other persons or other available resources are not sufficient to pay all burial expenses of an eligible person, the municipality shall pay up to \$650 to cover any remaining burial expenses. These expenses may include only removal of the body from a local residence or institution, procurement of a death certificate or obituary, embalming, minimal expenses for a casket and reasonable overhead costs.
- D. In addition to any payments made under paragraph C, the municipality shall pay that portion
