# 5 §4142. Responsibility of giving notice

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20 21 It shall be the responsibility of the listing real estate broker to assure that the notice is furnished. The purchaser shall have the right to have the tests conducted within a reasonable time specified in the notice, not to be less than 20 days. The purchaser may waive that right by a document signed by the purchaser. In the event that a purchaser waives the right or in the event that a purchaser proceeds to a closing upon the real estate, notwithstanding the disclosure in the tests of the presence of radon gas either in the domestic water or air, that person and his family, coresidents, invitees, lessees and tenants shall have no right of action against the sellers or the real estate brokers arising out of the presence of radon gas in the domestic water or air of the real estate so sold.

22 §4143. Concentration of radon.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The discovery of the proliferation of radioactive radon gas throughout many homes in the northeast and particularly in Maine has resulted in litigation, as well as a confusion as to the roles and obligations of the parties to a real estate transaction. This bill attempts to clarify the obligations and rights of those parties.

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
