1 2 3	AN ACT Concerning Fees Imposed on the Generation of Hazardous Waste.
4 5	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
6 7	Sec. 1. 38 MRSA \$1319-I, sub-\$3-A is enacted to read:
8 9 0 1 2	3-A. Fee on certain hazardous material. Any person who accepts the following materials in a solid, semisolid or liquid state and in a quantity exceeding 10,000 pounds per shipment shall pay a fee of 0.1¢ a pound:
3	A. Ammonia;
4	B. Chlorine;

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1	C. Hydrochloric acid;
2	D. Sodium hydroxide, caustic soda; and
3	E. Sulfuric acid.
4 5 6 7	No fee may be assessed when the hazardous material listed in this subsection is accepted by public water supply facilities or municipal waste water treatment plants.

## 10 STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill establishes a new fee to be levied upon recipients of certain hazardous materials. The fees will be deposited in the Maine Hazardous Waste Fund. This bill also repeals the annual ceiling on fees imposed on generators of hazardous waste.

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
